Commissioner Wortman **MOVED** to approve the agenda including the changes on page 3 with the addition of a discussion of filing the commissioner vacancy. Commissioner Measmer seconded the motion.

Following discussion, the **MOTION** carried with Chairman Morris, and Commissioners Wortman and Measmer voting for, and Vice Chairman Shue voting against.

3. COMMISSIONER AGENDA REQUESTS

3.1 BOC - Public Comment Discussion

Commissioner Measmer presented comments in support of the addition of public comments to the July 10th Work Session in connection with the commissioner vacancy.

Commissioner Wortman was not in favor of the addition of public comments at the work session.

Commissioner Measmer **MOVED** to add public comments to discuss the commissioner vacancy. There was not a second; Motion failed.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the Board approved to notify the Clerk of Superior Court of the appointment of the vacant Commissioner seat.

4. Discussion Items - No Action

4.0 County Manager - Filling of Commissioner Vacancy

A lengthy discussion ensued among the Board regarding filing the vacancy left by Commissioner Strang.

Commissioner Wortman **MOVED** to appoint Ray Helms to the fill the commissioner vacancy. There was not a second; Motion failed.

Discussions continued.

Vice Chairman Shue **MOVED** to discontinue discussion on the topic and that any member could forward a request before noon on Wednesday (July 12, 2023) to

call a Special Meeting on Friday after 12:00 noon to continue discussion (on the matter of filling the commissioner vacancy). There was not a second; Motion failed.

UPON MOTION of Chairman Morris, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the Board approved to open nominations for the commissioner vacancy.

Chairman Morris opened the floor for nominations.

Ray Helms and Diane Honeycutt were nominated.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, nominations are closed.

Ray Helms received one vote; Diane Honeycutt received two votes.

Commissioner Measmer **MOVED** to send a letter to the Clerk of Court on July 11, 2023 stating the Board has reached an impasse and according to NCGS 153 A.27, the matter is being sent to him for appointment. Commissioner Wortman seconded the motion.

Following discussion, the **MOTION** carried unanimously.

4.2 Department of Human Services (DHS) - Transportation Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal

Bob Bushey, Transportation Manager, reported due to a change in 5307 grant procedures, Cabarrus County has been in the process of becoming a direct recipient of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). In order to become a recipient, the County is required to establish a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal. Additionally, a public hearing will be required.

4.3 Infrastructure and Asset Management -Camp T.N. Spencer Park Masterplan Discussion

Kyle Bilafer, Assistant County Manager, appeared to the Board's direction and to move forward with a master plan for future needs of Camp T.N. Spencer Park.

Rodney Harris, Deputy County Manager, advised the Boys and Girls Club does not want to provide funding, but does support the plan and will adapt their programming according to facilities available.

A discussion ensued. During discussion, Mr. Bilafer responded to questions from the Board.

4.4 Planning & Development - Plot Plan/Survey and School Planning Capacity Report Discussion

Susie Morris, Planning and Development Director, reported currently a two-scale plot plan is required for permits. However, it has been discovered there is a disconnect in this process causing an increase in property with environmental matters/issues. Staff requested approval of the implementation of a survey in addition to the two-scale plot plan to the permit process when those conditions exist on property.

Ms. Morris advised the data for the weekly school planning capacity report has become difficult to obtain and not always current. Staff has been exploring a more effective way to capture the information. It is requested to discontinue the current report and continue to exploration of better reporting options.

Consensus from the Board was to discontinue the weekly school planning capacity report and for staff to continue exploring better reporting options.

There was discussion throughout. During discussion, Ms. Morris responded to questions from the Board.

5.2 County Manager - Easement for Duke Energy on Kannapolis Middle School Property

Kelly Sifford, Assistant County Manager, advised Kannapolis City Schools has requested the County provide an easement to Duke Energy to install an electric charging station for an electric bus (purchased with Duke Energy funds). Maps were provided showing the general locations of the existing lines and the planned installations.

5.3 Department of Human Services - Approval of Medicaid Expansion Positions

Karen Calhoun, presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Medicaid Expansion from the State. The program would allow people to qualify for services who are not currently eligible. Topics included the following:

5.5 Finance - Occupancy Tax Late Penalty Waiver Requests

Jim Howden, Finance Director, reported three hotels have requested a waiver on occupancy tax late fees and interest ("penalty") associated with late payments and late filings. Listed below are the hotels and requests:

- Sleep Inn Concord - late with their February Occupancy Tax in the amount of \$989.18
- Uptown Suites Concord - late with their March Occupancy Tax in the amount of \$991.62
- Home Towne Suites Kannapolis - late with their March Occupancy in the amount of \$523.39

5.6 Infrastructure and Asset Management - Cabarrus County Behavioral Health Center Project Update

Kyle Bilafer, Assistant County Manager, presented an update regarding the Behavioral Health Center. Mr. Bilafer stated from the schematic design estimate and the preliminary building design, cost is anticipated at \$52,000,000.

Rodney Harris, Deputy County Manager, provided additional information. Mr. Harris reported the County has received \$32,500,000 from the State. Staff is waiting for approval of the State budget to see if additional funds may be available.

Mr. Bilafer requested input from the Board whether to continue moving forward with the project.

A lengthy discussion ensued. During discussion, Mr. Bilafer and Mr. Harris responded to questions from the Board.

The consensus from the Board was to continue moving forward with the project.

5.7 Infrastructure and Asset Management -Vietnam Veterans Park Land Lease Amendment

Kyle Bilafer, Assistant County Manager, advised the second amendment to the original lease with the City of Kannapolis is expiring for a portion of the land housing Vietnam Veterans Park. The third amendment will be a three (3) year extension.

5.8 Juvenile Crime Prevention Council - Allocation of FY2023-24 Funding

Jim Howden, Finance Director, presented the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council County Funding Plan for FY2023-34.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Vice Chairman Shue, and unanimously carried, to suspend the Rules of Procedure.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman, and unanimously carried, approved the JCPC FY 2023-24 County Funding Plan.

Susie Morris, Planning and Development Director, presented a request from Quicksilver Custom Builders, LLC for water service in Area A of the Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement. The property is located at 4040 Mills Circle and will be developed for one single-family home.

5.10 Legal - Ad Hoc Amendment to Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement for 3868 Highway 200, Further Identified as PIN 5547-87-8632

Susie Morris, Planning and Development Director, presented a request from Allen Montgomery for water service in Area A of the Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement. The property is located at 3868 Highway 200 and will be developed for one single-family home.

5.11 Legal - Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement Update

Susie Morris, Planning and Development Director, reported Cabarrus County and the City of Concord adopted an Interlocal Agreement in 2008 as part of the Central Area Land Use Plan process. The agreement expired on June 29, 2023.

Staff has been working city staff have been working together to update the terms of the agreement. Some of the updates would be to help direct growth and maintenance of infrastructure system needs. A map along with the revised agreement was provided for the Board's review and consideration.

A discussion ensued. During discussion, Ms. Morris responded to questions from the Board.

5.12 Sheriff's Office - Acceptance of Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) Grant Award.

Van Shaw, Sheriff presented a request to accept the second year extension of the current Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) grant funding used for expansion of the Traffic Education and Enforcement Unit. The grant amount received is \$125,874.00 and will require a county match of \$53,946.00.

Sergeant Grady Christie was in attendance.

5.13 Sheriff's Office - Awarding of Service Weapon to Deputy Michael Elliott Upon his Retirement.

Sheriff Van Shaw requested the surplus and award of Deputy Michael Elliott's service weapon upon his retirement.

5.14 Solid Waste - Landfill - Replacement of Landfill Compactor

Kevin Grant, Environmental Management Director, presented a request for the Board's consideration to purchase of a landfill compactor. The cost was included in the Capital Improvement Plan projects for FY2024.

A discussion ensued. During discussion, Mr. grant responded to questions from the Board.

5.15 Tax Administration - Tax Collector's Annual Settlement and Order Authorizing Collection of FY 2023-2024 Taxes

David Thrift, Tax Administrator, advised the Tax Collector is required by NCGS 105-373 to give an annual settlement on current and delinquent taxes to the governing body for review and approval. The settlement report for FY2022-2023 was provided. The report contained real and personal taxes that remain unpaid for the fiscal year. The lists are recharged to the Tax Collector for collection.

Additionally, staff is in the process of identifying tax refund requests in comparison of FY2023 unpaid taxes for use of payment toward them.

Senior Center Advisory Council member Annette Swick resigned her position to move out of state.

At the June 19th council voted unanimously to recommend and appoint Karen Cobb to serve a 3-year.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved the Motion to remove Annette Swick from the Senior Center Advisory Council and thank her for her service.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved Motion to appoint Karen Cobb to the Senior Center Advisory Council for a 3-year term expiring July 31, 2026.

(D-2) Appointment and Removals - Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC)

During the June 21 regular meeting, the JCPC voted unanimously to recommend the appointment of Malisha Ross, LME/MCO Regional Director, as the Area Mental Health designee to complete the term vacated by Ms. LaShay Avery on June 2. Ms. Ross does not reside in Cabarrus County. An exception to the residency provision of the Appointment Policy will be needed.

The JCPC also voted unanimously to accept the resignation of Emily Coltrane as Chief Court Counselor Designee effective June 8. The Council then voted unanimously to recommend the appointment of Gayle Alston, Chief Court Counselor, as Court Counselor Designee to complete the unexpired term vacated by Ms. Coltrane. Ms. Alston does not reside in Cabarrus County. An exception to the residency provision of the Appointment Policy will be needed.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved the Motion to remove Emily Coltrane, Court Counselor designee, from the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council and thank her for her service.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved Motion to appoint Malisha Ross, LME/MCO Regional Director, as Area Mental Health Designee to complete the unexpired term of LaShay Avery that expires September 30, 2024 and Gayle Alston, Chief Court Counselor to complete the unexpired term of Emily Coltrane that expires September 30, 2024. Both will need an exception to the residency provision of the Appointment Policy.

(D-3) County Manager - Easement for Duke Energy on Kannapolis Middle School Property

Kannapolis City Schools and Duke Energy have requested an easement on the middle school property to install an electric charging station for an electric bus. The bus was purchased with funding received from Duke Energy, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NC DPI) and a grant from North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ). Attached are maps showing the general locations of the existing lines and the planned installations. The easement language is designed to be flexible for the installation. The installed lines will be the centerline for the easement.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved to grant an easement to Duke Energy on the Kannapolis Middle School Property and authorized the County Manager to execute the Easement Agreement on behalf of Cabarrus County, subject to review or revisions by the County Attorney.

(D-4) Department of Human Services - Approval of Medicaid Expansion Positions

The Department of Human Services (DHS) received two funding allocations, one for \$139,193 and the other for \$561,659, for a total of \$700,852 for implementation of Medicaid Expansion. This funding has been appropriated in the FY2024 department budget and will be used to hire thirty (30) additional

Medicaid staff. DHS can leverage an additional 75% reimbursement on the use of these funds or an additional \$525,639 in funding bringing the total available funding to \$1,226,491. The funds must be used for startup costs for expanding Medicaid. DHS anticipates an additional 15,583 to 17,794 potential new Medicaid eligibles with expansion.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board accepted funding allocations for startup costs in the implementation of the Department of Human Services Medicaid program expansion, which includes thirty new positions.

(D-5) Department of Human Services - Energy Programs Outreach Plan

The plan is designed to assure that eligible households are made aware of the assistance available through the Energy Programs.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved the plan.

(D-6) Finance - Occupancy Tax Late Penalty Waiver Requests

The three hotels listed below asked for a waiver on occupancy tax late fees and interest ("penalty") associated with late payments and late filings.

Sleep in Concord - Was late with their February Occupancy Tax. Penalties of \$989.18. Last late payment was 2017.

Uptown Suites Concord - Was late with their March Occupancy Tax. Penalties of \$991.62. Last late payment was 2017.

Home Towne Suites Kannapolis - Was late with their March Occupancy Tax. Penalties of \$523.39. Have never been late before.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved to waive the following Occupancy Tax late penalties and interest for Sleep Inn Concord of \$989.19, Upton Suites Concord of \$991.62 and Home Towne Suites Kannapolis of \$523.39 pursuant to G.S. 153A-155(e).

(D-7) Infrastructure and Asset Management -Vietnam Veterans Park Land Lease Amendment

County staff at the July 10, 2023 BOC Work Session presented the second amendment to the original lease with the City of Kannapolis for the land that houses Vietnam Veterans Park. The amendment has a three (3) year extension.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved the Lease Agreement between Cabarrus County and City of Kannapolis for the lease of PIN 5611199578, which is the land that houses Vietnam Veterans Park and authorized the County Manager to execute the Agreement on behalf of Cabarrus County, subject to review or revisions by the County Attorney.

(D-8) Legal - Ad Hoc Amendment to Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement for 4040 Mills Circle, Further Identified as PIN 5651-14-2940

The City of Concord received a request for water service in Area A of the Central Area Land Use Plan Interlocal Agreement. The request was from Quicksilver Custom Builders, LLC for property located at 4040 Mills Circle, further Identified as PIN 5651-14-2940. The property will be developed with one single-family home. Pursuant to the CALUP ILA, all requests for service in Area A must be jointly approved by the Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners and Concord City Council.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the board approved the request for the City of Concord to provide water service at 4040 Mills Circle, further Identified as PIN 5651-14-2940 and authorized the County Manager to execute the Agreement subject to review and approval by the County Attorney.

Cabarrus County and the City of Concord adopted an Interlocal Agreement in 2008 as part of the Central Area Land Use Plan process. The agreement expired on June 29, 2023.

County and city staff have been working together to update the terms of the agreement. The revised agreement was previously provided the Board of Commissioners for review and consideration.

(D-11) Sheriff's Office - Acceptance of Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) Grant Award

The extension of the second year of the current Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) grant funding will be used to expand the Traffic Education and Enforcement Unit. The grant amount of \$125,874.00 will be used for the continuation of this program. There is a county match of \$53,946.00 to meet eligibility of this grant.

3.1 County Manager - Arena & Events Center Provider Discussion

Rodney Harris, Deputy County Manager, opened discussion/questions in connection with the two presentations from the July 10, 2023 Work Session for a management provider at the Cabarrus Arena and Events Center. A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued on February 6, 2023, to obtain responses from parties interested in providing overall management of the Cabarrus Arena and Event Center. Evan Lee, General Counsel, advised the law firm, Baker McKenzie, approached the Cabarrus County Finance Department and Legal Department regarding execution of a Voluntary Disclosure Agreement between their client and the County related to pre-paid credit cards sent by the client to lodge operators for the payment of occupancy taxes. Upon review, some amounts were not remitted to the County. In exchange for a payment of \$19,681.22, the firm is seeking a

disclosure agreement to be negotiated and signed by the firm and the County's General Counsel. Mr. Lee requested input from the Board.

Chairman Morris stated the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) is requesting each county to designate a commissioner or other elected official as a voting delegate at the 116th NCACC Annual Business meeting in August 2023.

After a brief discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to delegate Chairman Morris as the voting delegate at the 116th NCACC Annual Business meeting.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Furr and unanimously carried, the Board suspended the Rules of Procedure due to time constraints.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the Board designated Chairman Morris as the voting delegate to represent Cabarrus County at the NCACC 116th Annual Business Session.

4.3 Budget - Vehicle Purchases

Rosh Khatri, Budget Director, provided a report regarding the purchase of six (6) vehicles for the following departments: Four (4) for Human Services - Child Welfare Division, one (1) for Emergency Medical Services and one (1) for Infrastructure Asset Management. These vehicles are needed due to increased utilization and new positions. The total cost will be \$231,000, which will come from General Fund - Fund Balance.

A discussion ensued. During discussion, Mr. Khatri and Rodney Harris, Deputy County manager, responded to questions from the Board.

4.4 County Manager - Revised Agreement with the Water and Sewer Authority of Cabarrus County

Kelly Sifford, Assistant County Manager, reported the Water and Sewer Authority has been working on a new agreement to allocate an additional 20,000 gallons to the town of Mount Pleasant to accommodate the new Mount Pleasant Active Living Center/Park and Library facility.

Rich Koch, County Attorney, provided additional information regarding the general assembly's contribution to the new allocations.

Vice Chairman Shue provided additional comments.

A discussion ensued. During discussion, Ms. Sifford responded to questions from the Board.

4.5 Department of Human Services - Family Caregiver Support Program Grant Budget Revision

Anthony Hodges, Social Work Program Administrator, presented a budget amendment for the Board's consideration for the additional funds of \$489.00 (over budgeted) received from the State for the Family Caregiver Support Program (FCSP). No county match is required.

4.6 Department of Human Services - FY24 Home and Community Care Block Grant (HCCBG) Funding Plan Revision

Anthony Hodges, Social Work Program Administrator, presented a budget amendment for the Board consideration. The FY24 budget included \$1,122,929 State grant funds for the Home and Community Care Block Grant (HCCBG). The State budget was approved after the County in which the County received \$1,192,773. The budget amendment will account for the additional funding. A 10% County match is required.

4.7 Department of Human Services -Transportation Rural State Operating Grant

Bob Bushey, Transportation Manager, reported Cabarrus County was awarded grant funds in the amount of \$191,000 for fuel through the North Carolina Department of Transportation Integrated Mobility Division (IMD). A county match is not required, however a budget amendment will be needed.

4.8 Fire Services- Mt. Pleasant Fire Department Staffing Grant Interlocal Agreement

Jacob Thompson, Fire Marshal, presented an Interlocal Agreement between Cabarrus County and the Town of Mt. Pleasant for the Board's review and consideration. The agreement will allow the approved FY24 funds to be allocated to the fire department for staffing.

4.9 Infrastructure and Asset Management -Frank Liske Park Office, Concessions, and Mini- Golf Renovations Bid Award

Kyle Bilafer, Assistant County Manager, and Michael Miller, Director of Design and Construction, reported an invitation was posted to bid on the Frank Liske Park Office, Concessions, and Mini-Golf Renovations project on June 23rd, 2023. A non-mandatory pre-bid meeting was held on site on July 6th, 2023. Bids were received and opened on July 27th, 2023, at 1:00 p.m. The recommendation of the low bidder was Ground Thunder Construction. Mr. Bilafer advised the total contract value (to include owner add-ons and contingency fees) will be \$1,836,875.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Furr and unanimously carried, the Board suspended the Rules of Procedure due to time constraints.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Commissioner Wortman and unanimously carried, the Board approved the contract amendment between Cabarrus County and Ground Thunder Construction and authorized the County Manager to execute the contract amendment on behalf of Cabarrus County, subject to review and revisions by the County Attorney.

4.10 Infrastructure and Asset Management - Library & Active Living Center at Mt. Pleasant and Virginia Foil Park Guaranteed Maximum Price

Kyle Bilafer. Assistant County Manager, presented for consideration a contract amendment for the Guaranteed Maximum Price with Edifice, LLC in connection with the Library and Active Living Center at Mt. Pleasant and Virginia Foil Park project. The total cost will be \$23,555,976.

Michael Miller, Design and Construction Director, was in attendance.

UPON MOTION of Vice Chairman Shue, seconded by Commissioner Wortman, and unanimously carried, to suspend the Rules of Procedure.

UPON MOTION of Commissioner Measmer, seconded by Vice chairman Shue, and unanimously carried, approved the contract amendment between Cabarrus County

and Edifice, LLC and authorized the County Manager to execute the contract amendment on behalf of Cabarrus County, subject to review or revisions by the County Attorney.

4.11 Planning Department - Budget Amendment to Revise HOME Grant 2020 and Close HOME Grant 2015 and Home Grant 2016

Susie Morris, Planning and Development Director, presented a budget amendment for consideration to revise HOME Grant 2020 revenues and expenditures for additional program fees received. It is also an appropriate time to close HOME Grant 2015 and HOME Grant 2016.

4.12 Sheriff's Office - Acceptance of Bike Safe Grant

Chief Deputy Tessa Burchett presented a budget amendment and resolution for consideration to accept grant funds received from the Governor's Highway Safety Program for the Bike Safe educational programs for motorcycle drivers. No county match is required.

4.13 Sheriff's Office - FY24 Radio Tower Revenues and Reappropriation of FY23 Radio Funds to FY24

Chief Deputy Tessa Burchett requested radio tower lease revenues from FY24, \$105,979 and remaining balance funds (\$252,320) from the General Fund be appropriated/re-appropriated into the FY24 budget for utilization of countywide radio expenses.

Chairman Morris opened discussion regarding electronic pet fencing arising from a citizen's comment at the July 17, 2023 Board of commissioners Regular Meeting.

Lt. Torelli provided additional information and guidance in connection with the ordinance and enforcement of it.

Mr. Gus Arango, resident of 5304 Harvest Hill Drive in Harrisburg commented on a neighbor's dog and safety concerns for his family.

A lengthy discussion ensued. During discussion, Sheriff Shaw and Lt. Torelli responded to questions from the Board.

Preamble

North Carolina State Extension (NC State Extension) was established as a part of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences of North Carolina State University (NCSU) by federal and state legislation for the specific purpose of “extending” the educational services of the University to the people of the state, on subjects related to agriculture and natural resources, family and consumer sciences, 4-H youth development, and community and rural development. The laws creating the Cooperative Extension Service were specifically designed to assure that the findings of research in these areas are communicated to the people of the State.

Under the Federal Appropriations Act of 1972, funds were provided to the 1862 land-grant universities (including NCSU) to enhance the extension outreach of the 1890 universities, which included North Carolina A & T State University (NCA&T). The Food and Agriculture Act of 1977 further stipulated that these funds be appropriated directly to the 1890 institutions, and formalized the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Program as an official part of the School of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences at NCA&T.

North Carolina Cooperative Extension (Cooperative Extension) provides the opportunity for North Carolina State Extension and North Carolina A & T Extension to work together to better serve the people of the State through the delivery of locally relevant programs, education and expertise.

The legislation further provided for a cooperative relationship among three levels of government – federal, state, and county – to ensure that the needs of all three levels are addressed. The primary purpose of Cooperative Extension is to provide the people of North Carolina with the most current and relevant unbiased research-based information – particularly that which is related to strengthening the economy through profitable, sustainable and safe food, forest and green industry systems; protecting the environment and natural resources; and empowering youth and families to lead healthier lives and become community leaders. These purposes are furthered by Cooperative Extension employees who are charged with carrying out the extension education programs of the universities and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Cooperative Extension has sufficient flexibility to permit attention to the special problems, needs, and interests of the citizens and leadership in each county. Therefore, the programmatic, personnel, and funding complement reflects the unique needs of each county. County Advisory Councils are consulted on a regular basis to assist in prioritizing the county educational program content. Program clientele or recipients of services include individuals, families, communities, municipalities, agricultural and seafood processing and marketing firms, other businesses and certain organizations. These services are delivered to adults and youth in both urban and rural settings.

To assure that educational programs offered by Cooperative Extension meet the needs of the local clientele, it is important that both elected and appointed decision makers at each level of government understand their respective responsibilities and relationships in conducting and funding this work. To this end, this Memorandum of Agreement will detail the individual relationships and mutually agreed-upon responsibilities of NCSU and each county or tribal community that signs this Memorandum of Agreement.

Part I.
NC State Extension will:

1. Establish minimum requirements and qualifications for employment in Cooperative Extension work.
2. Receive and examine applications for employment.
3. Interview and screen applicants to determine their qualifications and availability.
4. Consult with the Board of County Commissioners, or the County Manager as designee, regarding qualified applicants for appointment to vacant or new Cooperative Extension positions.
5. Consult with the Board of County Commissioners, or the County Manager as designee, regarding the salaries and salary splits of all Cooperative Extension employees, including but not limited to County Extension Directors, Extension Agents, and County Operations Support Staff (COSS).
6. Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Board of County Commissioners, or the County Manager as designee, for securing the county's share of funds for salaries and operating expenses each based on the state fiscal year.
7. Provide funds for official travel necessary to conduct Cooperative Extension work and postage funds, to the extent that funds are available, and for purposes authorized by state and federal policies.
8. Accept responsibility and provide the leadership for administration and supervision of Cooperative Extension programs and personnel, including compliance with affirmative action and equal employment opportunity requirements. NC State will investigate all cases of discrimination, harassment, or retaliation following applicable NC State policies.
9. Investigate and manage all employee relations issues related to NC State employees housed in local offices. We will work collaboratively with local county government and NC A&T University when an issue impacts their employees.
10. Develop and administer a personnel management plan that will provide the annual review of each employee's performance, counseling for job improvement where needed, and periodic county program reviews.
11. Provide a staff of specialists to train agents in current technology and other changes affecting agriculture and natural resources, family and consumer sciences, 4-H and youth, and community and rural development, and to otherwise assist them in conducting work in these areas.

12. Provide Cooperative Extension professionals with training programs as needed to maintain effective program delivery.
13. Seek regular input from the County and maintain a County Advisory Leadership System to ensure that county Cooperative Extension programs are based on the particular needs of people in their respective county.
14. Prepare and submit a "Report to the People" to the Board of Commissioners, or the County Manager as designee, at least annually, informing the Board or Manager of Cooperative Extension programs and work accomplished.

Part II. The Board of County Commissioners will:

1. Provide the County's share of salaries and benefits for Cooperative Extension personnel.
2. Comply with North Carolina's Workers Compensation Act, N.C. General Statute § 97-2(2).
3. Provide offices, equipment, utilities, telephones, office supplies, instructional materials and other items needed for efficient operation of the County Extension Center and its programs; and comply with the accessibility provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
4. Review and consider the annual budget request from NCSU, and take appropriate action by July 1 of each fiscal year.
5. Provide regular input to the District and County Extension Directors on the particular needs of people in their respective county to help ensure that county Cooperative Extension programs are based on specific needs and meet county programming plans.

Part III. NC State Extension and the Board of County Commissioners mutually agree:

1. That all county Cooperative Extension employment appointments and separations will be made in consultation between NCSU and the Board of County Commissioners, or the County Manager as designee, and that no official action related to such appointments or separations will be taken by either party regarding appointment or separation prior to discussion of the matter with the other party.
2. That the Board of County Commissioners and NCSU shall each be responsible for compliance with applicable laws and regulations relating to their respective operations.
3. To cooperate in implementing affirmative action and equal employment opportunity plans of NCSU.

4. The parties will work together to maintain an environment of high-quality cooperation and services. At the request of any party, a meeting or conference will promptly be held between the Parties' representatives to resolve any problems or develop any improvements.
5. That the policies established by the State of North Carolina under N.C. General Statute §126 and followed by the UNC System for SHRA employees be used in the granting and administration of leave related to the earning rates, transfer policies, payout computation and timing, and administration of vacation, sick, civil, community involvement, military, Family and Medical Leave, Family Illness Leave, leaves of absence, and other approved leave programs for Cooperative Extension personnel.
6. That Cooperative Extension employees will follow county policies relative to office hours, office closings for inclement weather, and holidays, and for the management and use of county property.
7. That personnel procedures are as follows:
 - (a) Establishing Accounts to Operationalize the Payroll Process.
 - i. To operationalize the payroll arrangement, NCSU will establish a Trust Fund Account for the County at NCSU that will serve as the vehicle for the transfer of funds from the County to NCSU for use in paying the county's agreed-upon share of salary and benefits for Cooperative Extension personnel.
 - ii. Procedure for Providing Funds to the Account. A State Treasurer's Electronic Payment System (STEPS) form will be completed and the original submitted to the Assistant Extension Director of HR and Operational Strategy via the appropriate District Extension Director. The County Finance Officer, or the designated County representative, will receive notification from the NCSU College of Agriculture and Life Sciences HR Office prior to the University's payroll date, generally the last working day of each month, advising the amount due for the current payroll. Within 5 business days following the payday, the respective University will draft against the County's established trust account in the amount communicated.
 - iii. Administration of the Account. The trust account will be maintained in accordance with the respective NCSU accounting policies and procedures. The trust account will be audited and reconciled by the NCSU College of Agriculture and Life Sciences Business Office to ensure the month-end account balance remains zero.
 - (b) Employee Benefits.
 - i. Retirement Benefits. All Extension Personnel will participate solely in either the North Carolina Teachers and State Employees Retirement System (TSERS) and accompanying North Carolina Disability Income Plan, or the Optional Retirement Plan, based on eligibility criteria established by the State. They will be eligible solely for respective NCSU employee benefits for which they qualify based on their appointment and FTE, and former federal appointees will maintain federal benefits, the employer-paid parts of which will be paid for solely by NCSU.

(c) Taxes and Fringe Benefits.

i. The County will be responsible for providing their proportional share of fringe benefits for all Cooperative Extension personnel, including but not limited to the following:

1. Employer contributions to all applicable Federal and State taxes.
2. Employer contribution to TSERs per N.C. General Statute §135, or to ORP per N.C. General Statute §135-5.1.
3. Employer contribution to the Health Insurance matching charges per N.C. General Statute §135.

(d) Workers' Compensation will be administered pursuant to N.C. General Statute §97-2(2). The County will provide full and direct coverage for those employees subject to the County workers' compensation insurance within the county insurance program. Employees for whom the County will maintain workers' compensation coverage are the following:

1. All administrative and any other positions designated as County Operations Support Staff (COSS); and
 - a. All Program Assistants/Associates who are not funded by directly allocated federal funds such as EFNEP, or Program Assistants/Associates who are paid in part by EFNEP funds but which account for less than 50% funding.
 - b. NCSU will provide full and direct coverage for their respective Cooperative Extension employees subject to NCSU's workers' compensation insurance. Cooperative Extension employees for whom NCSU will maintain workers' compensation coverage are the following:
 - i. All County Extension Directors and Extension Agents; and
 - ii. All Program Assistants or Associates who are funded by directly allocated federal funds such as EFNEP, or Programs Assistants or Associates who are paid in part by EFNEP funds at equal to or more than 50% funding.

(e) Employee Separation

1. NCSU will process severance pay for reductions-in-force (RIFs) as delineated in the COSS Employee Handbook for County Operations Support Staff (COSS).
2. Upon an employee's separation, the County will pay out its proportional share of annual/vacation leave, up to a maximum of 240 hours per the OSHR and/or UNC System guidelines, and any applicable bonus leave balance.

3. The County will pay its proportional share of state longevity for COSS employees upon an employee's service anniversary date.
4. The County will pay out its proportional share of any accrued "extra" time (hour-for-hour) or overtime (1.5 hour-for-hour) to Cooperative Extension employees that are subject to Fair Labor Standards Act or the North Carolina Wage and Hour Act upon an employee's earning anniversary date or as due to the employee at the time of separation.

(f) Optional County-paid Salary Increases or Bonuses to Cooperative Extension Personnel.

At their discretion, Counties may award additional permanent salary increases or one-time pay awards ("bonuses") to Cooperative Extension personnel. If such salary increases or bonuses are proposed by the County under the "non-lock-in" payroll arrangement, they must be communicated to the appropriate District Extension Director's office no later than the first day of any month in which the proposed increase or bonus is to be applied. Increases must be entered in the current fiscal year.

(g) Lock-In Provision

This section describes the preferred arrangement to support the salary agreement between the County and NCSU for Extension personnel. All counties will participate in the Lock-In provision unless designated on an Opt-Out Addendum the arrangement as Non Lock-In.

1. **Salary Adjustments for Extension Employees under the Lock-In Provision.** The full compensation plan for university employees as approved by the General Assembly and implemented by the Office of the President, University of North Carolina System, will serve as the basis for all compensation adjustments and both the County and NCSU will adhere to the plan's effective dates and implementation instructions. Cooperative Extension personnel receiving salary from grant funds will be governed by the terms and conditions of the applicable grant within the scope and applicability of NCSU personnel policies governing grants. These compensation components include, but are not limited to:

Across-the-board adjustments,
Cost-of-living adjustments (COLA),
Merit adjustments,
Bonuses (in any form conveyed), and
Promotion, classification, market, or equity adjustments.

Salary and Benefits. Salaries and benefits, as delineated above in 7(a-e), will be split according to the hiring agreement and will be detailed on an attached addendum. As both parties may provide increases, these percentages will change slightly from the original hire percentage.

2. County Increases in the Lock-In Provision

The County may elect to include NCSU employees in County increases, bonuses, etc. at any time. See 7(f) for more information on submitting county increases. Lock-In Provision indicates that all State adjustments will be honored and automatically drafted, but the County is not limited to just the State increases in this agreement.

Part IV.

DURATION, AMENDMENT, AND TERMINATION

The parties will conduct a periodic review of this collaboration and responsibilities to determine and evaluate whether the parties are achieving the goals and accomplishing the responsibilities activities herein. No amendment of the terms of this Agreement will be effective unless made in writing and signed by each Party's authorized signatory.

Signatures of the persons below authorize execution of this document, effective as of July 1, 2023, and continuing year-to-year, unless otherwise terminated in writing by either party under written notification to the other party no less than one-hundred twenty (120) days prior to the proposed termination date. Termination of this Memorandum of Agreement shall have the effect of terminating the Cooperative Extension activities and programs in the County.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA)

BETWEEN

The Public Health Authority of Cabarrus County, *d.b.a.* Cabarrus Health Alliance
AND

Cabarrus County Department of Human Services under AH-TP1-23-001: *Advancing Equity in Adolescent Health through Evidence-Based Teen Pregnancy Prevention Programs and Services*

This document constitutes a Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter referred to as “MOA” or “the MOA”) between The Public Health Authority of Cabarrus County, *dba* Cabarrus Health Alliance (hereinafter called “CHA”) and Subrecipients.

I. Purpose & Background

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Population Affairs (OPA) has announced fiscal year 2023 funds to implement AH-TP1-23-001: *Advancing Equity in Adolescent Health through Evidence-Based Teen Pregnancy Prevention Programs and Services* (herein after called *Advancing Equity*). Consistent with the authority of Division H, Title II of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public Law No. 117-328), this notice solicits applications for projects to serve communities and populations with the greatest needs and facing significant disparities to advance equity in adolescent health through the replication of evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs (EBPs) and services. Funding for projects authorized under this Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is to replicate EBPs and not for service delivery.

The purpose of this MOA is to document the efforts and collaboration of CHA and its local partners to carry out the objectives of the *Advancing Equity* funding, if awarded.

II. Roles & Responsibilities

A. CHA agrees to the following roles and responsibilities under this MOA in support of the goals of this cooperative agreement:

- Serve as prime recipient of funds under AH-TP1-23-001
- Coordinate cross-county Learning Collaborative activities
- Provide primary programmatic and financial reporting to the OPA
- Keep all subrecipients informed of their subaward budgets and balance through the end of the subaward or entire cooperative agreement.
- Provide to subrecipients required training consistent with the Notice of Award, including but not limited to: evidence-based programs (EBP), data collection, monitoring, staff development, trauma-informed approaches, and equity; as appropriate.
- Ensure fiscal procedures in order to track, monitor, and report expenditures in a timely manner, consistent with the NOFO and 45 CFR 75
- Maintain compliance with other provisions and restrictions as described in the NOFO or Notice of Award, including Employee Whistleblower Protections, Copyright Interest Provisions, Funding Restrictions, HHS Grants Policy Statement, HHS 690, Title XI and Section 1557.

B. The Subrecipient agrees to the following roles, responsibilities and contributions under this MOA in support of the goals of this project:

Roles:

- Serve as the subrecipient of awarded funds under the *Advancing Equity* project, AH-TP1-23-001
- Maintain organizational capacity to effectively, efficiently, and implement locally-tailored evidence- and practice-based strategies within the period of performance
- As indicated in the NOFO, Subrecipient agrees to meet each of the below expectations in the execution of the subaward:
 1. Focus on areas of greatest need and facing significant disparities
 2. Engage in a planning period
 3. Replicate to scale evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs with fidelity and quality
 4. Engage with CHA to review materials prior to implementation to be age-appropriate and medically-accurate, culturally and linguistically-appropriate, trauma-informed, and inclusive of all youth
 5. Engage youth, caregivers, and the community throughout your subaward
 6. Connect or strengthen your network of adolescent-friendly supportive services
 7. Ensure equitable, safe, supportive, and inclusive environments
 8. Monitor and improve the overall project to ensure services offered are equitable, accessible, of the highest quality, and best fit for the communities and populations served

Responsibilities:

- Receive training from OPA, Cabarrus Health Alliance, or *Advancing Equity*-contracted partners to include but not limited: evidence-based programs (EBP), data collection, monitoring, staff development, trauma-informed approaches, and equity, as appropriate, or as indicated in the Notice of Award
- Participate in cross-county Learning Collaborative activities
- Implement communication strategies that will support awareness, acceptance of, and recruitment into the selected evidence-based programs (i.e. parent/guardian, school board, or administrator communications, as appropriate to each setting)
- Assure that materials and language used are respectful of and responsive to the cultural and linguistic needs of the population being served. This includes being respectful and responsive to individual cultural health beliefs and practices, preferred languages, health literacy levels, and communication needs
- Develop and/or leverage partnerships and/or coalitions to help mobilize resources, influence systems, and serve as catalysts for changing policies, programs, and practices within the community
- Monitor progress of the subaward budget, activities, and deliverables, including participation in the Monitoring and Improvement Plan (MIP) as appropriate to the subaward
- Provide timely progress reports on subaward context, outcome-related performance measures, health equity approaches, successes, challenges, and lessons learned throughout periodic reporting as established in the Notice of Award
- Participant in any required OPA or CHA evaluation guidance, technical assistance, or support webinars, trainings, monthly calls, and/or written materials
- Ensure fiscal procedures in order to track, monitor, and report expenditure in a timely manner, consistent with the NOFO and 45 CFR 75

- All prior financial approval requests must be submitted by the 15th of the month proceeding the month in which items wishes to be executed. CHA requests five business days to review and approve in writing approval or denial or request for more information.
- All expenditure reports are due by the 30th of the month following the completion of the project and/or request for reimbursement (ex: reimbursement for staffing costs for the month of April should be submitted no later than 30th of May).
- Maintain compliance with other provisions and restrictions as described in the NOFO or Notice of Award, including Employee Whistleblower Protections, Copyright Interest Provisions, Funding Restrictions, HHS Grants Policy Statement, HHS 690, Title XI and Section 1557.

Contributions

- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will select at least one evidence-based program by October 2023 to implement upon approval from OPA
- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will reach at least 25 youth through the selected evidence-based program(s) each year
Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will reach at least 1 caregiver/parent through the selected evidence-based program(s) each year
- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will train at least 3 other youth serving professionals in year 1
- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will ensure all EPB facilitators are trained in selected evidence-based programs by sending staff to CHA sponsored trainings
- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services will address trainer turnover by ensuring new trainer(s) attend all required or booster trainings
- Cabarrus County Department of Human Services agrees to attend Learning Collaborative meetings during project period

III. It is mutually understood and agreed by and between the Parties that:

- CHA and the Subrecipient will work in collaboration to share information on cases for which both the Parties are involved.
- Both the Parties agree to provide all services detailed within this MOA.
- Both the Parties agree to coordinate the project activities of all groups participating in their local portion of this project.
- Both the Parties agree to abide by Federal and State guidelines regarding equal opportunity, drug-free workplace(s), and financial reporting.

IV. Responsible Personnel

A) Suspension and Debarment

Part 60); Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148); Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 3145); Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708); Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q.) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387); Debarment and Suspension (Executive Orders 12549 and 12689); Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352); Procurement of Recovered Materials (2 C.F.R. § 200.322); the Federal Uniform Administration Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards ("Uniform Guidance") codified at 2 C.F.R. 200 Subpart F; and Record Retention Requirements (2 CFR § 200.324).

D) Civil Rights

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Pub. L. 88-352), as amended, and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to the Department of Health and Human Services (45 C.F.R. F) *The American with Disabilities Act 1990*

ADA makes it unlawful to discriminate in employment against a qualified individual with a disability and outlaws discrimination against individuals with disabilities in State and local government services and public accommodations. The Region 4 LHD certifies that it and its principals will comply with regulations in ADA Title II (Public Services) and Title III (Public Accommodations) in fulfilling the obligations under this MOA.

Resources

Cabarrus Health Alliance will issue a subaward of \$15,000 to Cabarrus County Department of Human Services (Subrecipient) for the purposes of carrying out the aforementioned Roles and Responsibilities. The subaward will be re-issued annually, contingent on available funds and completion of subaward deliverables. All subawards are contingent on funding from the OPA under Cooperative Agreement AH-TP1-23-001.

Effective Date and Signature

This MOA shall be effective upon the signature of CHA and Cabarrus County Department of Human Services authorized officials. It shall be in force from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2028. CHA and Rowan County Health Department indicate agreement with this MOA by their respective signatures, as follows.

I hereby agree to serve as the lead agency for my sections of this project, and I agree to abide by the terms and conditions contained in this Memorandum of Agreement between The Public Health Authority of Cabarrus County and Cabarrus County Department of Human Services for the purpose and scope described in detail in this document.

BRIEF SUMMARY:

A few significant changes in Child Welfare Legislation will impact our current FY2024 budget.

1. An increase in the board rate for Foster Care and Adoption Assistance that were not included in our initial budget request. This legislation was passed in June after our budget was approved. The language is cited below:

Foster Care Rates and Licensing: S. L. 2023-14, Section 6.7 increases the monthly foster care and adoption assistance rates effective July 1, 2023. For Children 0-5 years old, the rates will increase from \$514 to \$702; for children ages 6-12 years old rates will increase from \$654 to \$742; for children, aged 13-17 and 18-21 years of age will have a rate increase from \$698 to \$810. Foster care and adoption assistance rates are codified at G.S. 108A-49.1.

2. Kinship Care relative placements were not a part of our approved budget. S.L. 2023-14, Section 6.6 requires the Division of Social Services at the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to develop and implement a policy that allows a relative (related by blood, marriage, or adoption) of a juvenile who is providing foster care to receive half the reimbursement rate of a licensed family foster home. The monthly rates of an unlicensed relative placement are \$351 (ages 0-5); \$371 (ages 6-12); and \$405 (ages 13-17). The State and County will share 50% of the nonfederal share of the costs. The state share, \$5,766,390 in recurring funds has been appropriated to the Division for the 2023-2025 biennium effective by November 16, 2023.

Summary:

We are seeing an increased number of children in foster care. We initially budgeted for 115 children and with the budget increase we projected 160 children for the increased rate of foster care and children identified in kinship placements. To date, we have 192 children in care currently.

Our initial budget estimate for FY 2024 was \$2,261,476.00 for placement costs. After the budget was passed, we received a letter in June from DHHS with increased budget rates going into effect on July 1, 2023. In September, we received additional notification about payments for kinship placements that will take effect on November 1, 2023. Based on the projections of the newly implemented rates and the increasing number of children coming into care; we are projecting a need of \$2,882,004 to cover the fiscal year for FY 2024. Please review the table below for a breakdown of expenses and revenues:

Sample County Implementation Plan of Unlicensed Kinship Payments

Identification of Current Impacted Children

1. Review draft eligibility criteria.
2. Identify all children who are in unlicensed kinship placements who meet the definition of relative per SB20: Child(ren) must be related to the kinship care provider through blood, marriage, or adoption, providing foster care as defined under G.S. 131D-10.2(9).

Counties utilizing Legacy/Child Placement and Payment System

If counties do not have a way of identifying the affected populations, we recommend using the PQA084 Quarterly Case List report. This report provides information on children's living arrangements. The affected population would typically be identified by Living Arrangements 52 (Home of Relative), 66 (Adoptive Home- Relative) and 99 (Other – Placement Approved by the Court).

Counties utilizing Child Welfare Information System

If counties do not have a way of identifying the affected populations, counties can pull the "CWIS Open Foster Care Cases and Living Arrangements" report from Client Services Data Warehouse (CSDW) to determine which children are residing in non-paid relative placements. The report can be found by using the following file path within CSDW:

- i. DHHS Main Document → DSS → Child Welfare → State Sanctioned.
3. Break down by age group and provide projected cost to DSS Finance Manager for budget purposes.

Budget

1. County DSS Finance Manager to present impact to budget line item for FY23-24 to agency Director
2. Director to determine if any budget amendment is required.
3. Director to present to County Commissioners, if needed.

Business Process

1. Develop county business process for Facility ID Request for unlicensed kinship initial ID requests, updates, renewals, and terminations; identify who is responsible for completing and who needs to be notified. (NC DSS will reimburse the state share of the cost to counties for unlicensed kinship payments through a facility ID number process, similar to the [DSS-5015 Foster Home Facility Action Request](#) form).
2. Develop business process for unlicensed kinship payment eligibility checklist—who will complete for current children in custody and who is responsible for new children entering

custody. (NCDSS will provide this form/checklist at the time of the final policy, however, counties can view the draft eligibility criteria at the bottom of this document.)

3. Develop business process for communicating with county DSS finance team to issue payments.

Training/Communication

1. Develop training plan for staff (NC DSS will offer office hours for county agencies in November - registration information will be sent in a future DCDL).
2. Develop communication plan for current unlicensed kinship placements.
3. Develop communication plan for potential unlicensed kinship placements.
4. Develop strategy for continued advocacy/encouragement for kinship caregivers to become licensed.
5. Develop communication plan for external stakeholders (Court, GAL program, etc.).

Target Date for Implementation: 11/16/23

Draft Eligibility Criteria

Once potential relative caregivers are identified, county agencies should review the following eligibility requirements to determine if the child and kinship caregiver meet criteria to begin receiving payments in November. This will assist counties in preparing for budgetary impacts and determine which kinship caregivers counties will need to set up as vendors.

Children and families must meet certain criteria to be eligible to receive reimbursement funding for unlicensed kinship care provider. All of the following criteria must be met:

- a. Child(ren) must be in the custody of a local child welfare agency while receiving payments;
- b. The kinship care provider must be approved by the Court and designated in the court order pursuant to [N.C.G.S. 7B-505](#);
- c. Child(ren) must be related to the kinship care provider through blood, marriage, or adoption, providing foster care as defined under G.S. 131D-10.2(9);
- d. The placement must be an unlicensed kinship care provider;
- e. The kinship provider must agree to receive payments;
- f. County child welfare agency has completed and approved appropriate background checks and kinship care assessments at appropriate intervals (refer to section KINSHIP CARE ASSESSMENT: LICENSURE AND APPROVAL in Permanency Planning Manual).

PURPOSE

This letter is to inform county agencies of legislative approval under Senate Bill 20 for the establishment of reimbursement rates for unlicensed kinship care providers and the continuation of the Bridge funding.

Continuation of Bridge Funding for Congregate Care

The Family First Prevention Services Act incentivizes the placement of children in family homes by decreasing the allowance of federal funding to pay for congregate care. To support counties in this transition, the General Assembly appropriated funding to cover the loss of this federal revenue. This funding, called Foster Care Bridge funding, will continue to be available for the 2023-2024 State fiscal year and the distribution will continue to follow the process already in place. County agencies should also continue to follow the original guidance provided for data entry.

Reimbursement Rates for Unlicensed Kinship Providers

The General Assembly, during the 2023 legislative session with [Senate Bill 20](#), established a reimbursement fund to assist in supporting unlicensed kinship care providers who are related by blood, marriage, or adoption and are providing foster care as defined under G.S. 131D-10.2(9).

The Senate Bill 20 legislation includes reimbursement rates set for unlicensed kinship providers. All counties are required to participate in this program and work in partnership with the State to support kinship providers in the following manner:

1. Identifying foster children affected by this new legislation.
2. Using the current Foster Care board rates based on age groups.
3. Taking one quarter (1/4) of the board rate for county participation rate.

The State reimbursement share will also be one quarter (1/4) of the board rate.

The chart below illustrates the newly increased Foster Care and Adoption Assistance Rates as of July 1, 2023. It is important to have the current board rates, as Senate Bill 20 provides that unlicensed kinship providers are reimbursed at half the board rate.

Effective July 1, 2023, the Standard Board Rate:

Child Age Group	Standard Board Rate
0-5	\$702 / month
6-12	\$742 / month
13 and up	\$810 / month

Effective November 16, 2023, the approximate half board reimbursement rates for unlicensed kinship foster care by State and county participation are displayed below:

Child Age Group	Standard Board Rate	State Participation	County Participation
0-5	\$351 / month	175.50	175.50
6-12	\$371 / month	185.50	185.50
13 and up	\$405 / month	202.50	202.50

Because this law was enacted May 16, 2023, the responsibility for the county share may be a cost for which counties did not plan. We recommend counties start identifying affected populations, developing internal processes for payment, and preparing for budgetary impacts. If you do not have a way of identifying the affected populations, we recommend using the PQA084 Quarterly Case List report. This report provides information on children's living arrangements. The affected population would typically be identified by Living Arrangements 52 and 66.

As part of the process, county agencies will be creating payments directly to the primary parent in a kinship placement. Counties will need to work with their financial support unit to establish vendors. Information should be gathered for the primary payee of the kinship family including parent name, address, and phone number. Additional information requirements should include date of birth, social security number, race, and sex of the primary payee.

DHHS will provide updates as warranted. If you have any questions, please contact your Regional Child Welfare Specialist about kinship care and your local Business Liaison about Bridge Funding.

PURPOSE

This letter will provide county agencies with guidance as to foster care rates. In addition, the attached listing indicates private agencies *who have completed the rate setting process and are eligible for Cost Modeled Rates* in the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

Standard board rates for foster care (and adoption services)

As of July 1, 2023, foster care board rates have increased. As related to foster care services, the following rates should be utilized for North Carolina licensed placements including, but not limited to DSS family foster homes, Therapeutic family foster care services, Residential Treatment (Level 2), and payments to licensed providers **not** participating in cost modeled rates.

Effective July 1, 2023, and ongoing the Standard Board rate for foster services is as follows:

Child Age Group	Standard Board Rate
0 – 5	\$ 702 / month
6 – 12	\$ 742 / month
13 and up	\$ 810 / month

Standardized Rates for Residential Child Care Agencies and Child Placing Agencies providing foster care services under Cost Modeled Rate Status

Through participation in an annual cost finding and rate setting process, Residential Child Care Agencies and Child Placing Agencies (CPA) establish a supportable basis for state and federal participation above the standard board rate. Including the increase in the board rates, the Cost Modeled Rates for the state fiscal year 2023-2024 are as follows:

CABARRUS COUNTY

BOARDS, COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND AUTHORITIES

The Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners makes appointments to a number of boards, committees, commissions and authorities. All citizens of Cabarrus County are encouraged to volunteer to serve on these boards/committees. To obtain an application for appointment or for more information, please contact the Clerk to the Board, at the Governmental Center, 65 Church Street, SE, Concord, or call (704) 920-2109. The application may also be downloaded from the County's website at www.cabarruscounty.us.

A listing of the boards/committees is as follows:

ACTIVE LIVING AND PARKS COMMISSION

This commission advises on parks and recreation needs of County residents and assists the Parks Department in planning facilities and operational activities. The 11-member commission includes a representative from each of the 7 planning areas (Concord, Eastern, Kannapolis, Central, Midland, Northwest Cabarrus and Harrisburg), 2 at-large representatives, 1 representative from the Cabarrus School Board and 1 representative from the Kannapolis School Board. Appointments are for terms of three years.

ADULT CARE HOME COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This committee seeks to maintain the intent of the Adult Care Home Residents Bill of Rights and to promote community involvement with the homes (homes for the aged, family care homes and homes for developmentally disabled adults). Members cannot be employed by an adult care home nor have any financial interest, directly or indirectly, in an adult care home. Immediate family of an adult care home resident in Cabarrus County cannot serve on the committee. Initial appointment is for a term of one year with successive appointments of three-year terms.

AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY BOARD

The Agricultural Advisory Board is designed to implement the provisions of the Voluntary Agricultural District Ordinance. The Board is charged with accepting applications to the voluntary agricultural districts, promoting the enhancement of agriculture in our county, and assisting the Cabarrus County Commissioners with information and positions regarding decisions impacting agricultural production in our county.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION AND REVIEW

This board: (1) reviews the tax lists of the county for the current year to assure that all property is listed and appraised accurately; (2) hears any property owner's appeal concerning the value assigned to his property (or that of others); and (3) has the authority to make adjustments necessary to bring the valuation into line with the standards established by law. Members serve three-year terms.

CABARRUS COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

This commission serves a key role in shaping the future development of the county as it reviews subdivisions, assists in area plans, and makes land use decisions, some of which are forwarded to the Board of Commissioners. The commission also serves as the Board of Adjustment that hears and decides appeals of decisions by the Zoning Enforcement Officer, and grants special use permits/variances. Members include a representative from each of the 7 planning areas (Concord, Midland, Central, Eastern, Harrisburg, Kannapolis and Northwest Cabarrus), 2 at-large representatives and 3 Alternate members. Appointments are for terms of three years.

CENTRALINA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD

This group serves as the governing body for a variety of programs and their plans, including the Job Training Partnership Act, Work First (JOBS) welfare and placement programs, the Older Worker Americans Act Job Training and Employment Program, etc. The County Commissioners appoint 4 persons representing Education, Organized Labor and the Private Sector (2) to serve on this six-county, 20-member board. Appointments are for terms of two years.

CONCORD PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

The Commission guides, reviews and regulates land developments within and around the boundaries of the City of Concord. The County Commissioners appoint one member who resides in Concord's extraterritorial jurisdiction area for a term of three years.

HARRISBURG FIRE ADVISORY BOARD

The Harrisburg Fire Advisory Board advises the Town Council, Town Administrator and the Fire Chief on matters of policy, administration and operations. The board tracks the progress of the Harrisburg Fire Department's key objectives as outlined in the annual report, reviews the Department's By-Laws on an annual basis, and recommends changes to the Town Council for final approval.

HARRISBURG PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD

This board reviews, regulates development within and around the boundaries of the Town of Harrisburg and hears and decides on appeals of zoning within the Town's jurisdiction. The County Commissioners appoint one person who resides in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the Town to serve for a term of three years.

HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE BLOCK GRANT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This advisory committee assists the Department of Aging with the development of the County Aging Funding Plan through the Home and Community Care Block Grant for Older Adults. The committee is composed of potential public and private providers of aging services, elected county officials, older adults and representatives of other aging interests in the county.

HUMAN SERVICES ADVISORY BOARD

This board is appointed by the Board of Commissioners to advocate, advise and consult regarding services within the Department of Human Services. The board is composed of five members who are appointed for three-year terms.

In the first year of organization, the terms will be staggered with three members appointed to

three-year terms and two members appointed to two-year terms.

INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES AND POLLUTION CONTROL FINANCING AUTHORITY

This authority provides for the issuance of revenue bonds to aid in financing (1) industrial and manufacturing facilities which provide job opportunities or better ways to help alleviate unemployment and raise below-average manufacturing wages and (2) pollution control facilities for industries. The 7-member authority meets as needed. Appointments are for terms of six years.

JURY COMMISSION

This commission is responsible for compiling the jury lists for the Courts. The Board of Commissioners appoints one member for a term of two years to the 3-member commission.

JUVENILE CRIME PREVENTION COUNCIL

The council plans for the needs of adjudicated and at-risk youth and assesses the need for delinquency treatment and prevention services in Cabarrus County. The 25-member council is made up of a variety of judicial and public agency representatives as well as seven at-large members. Appointments are for terms of two years.

LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The board advises the County Commissioners on matters relating to the Cabarrus County Library system, including the planning of programs, policies, facilities and budgetary matters.

The seven-member board includes representatives selected from the areas of Concord (one member appointed by the Concord City Council and one member appointed by the County Commissioners), Mt. Pleasant, Harrisburg, Midland, and Kannapolis (2). Appointments are for terms of three years.

MOUNT PLEASANT PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

This board guides, reviews, regulates land development within and around the boundaries of the Town of Mt. Pleasant and hears and decides on appeals of zoning within the Town's jurisdiction. The Board of Commissioners appoints two persons who reside within the Town's extraterritorial jurisdiction area for terms of three years.

NURSING HOME COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This committee seeks to maintain the intent of the Nursing Home Residents Bill of Rights for those persons residing in nursing homes, works to ensure appropriate conditions within the nursing homes and promotes community involvement with those homes. Members cannot be employed by a nursing home nor have any financial interest, directly or indirectly, in a nursing home. Also, no immediate family of a nursing home resident in Cabarrus County can serve on the committee. Initial appointments are made for terms of one year with successive appointments of three years.

PUBLIC HEALTH AUTHORITY OF CABARRUS COUNTY

The authority seeks to enhance public/private health care partnerships, stabilize county dollars going to support health services, and to provide consolidation and long range planning for health services. It also acts as the local board of health and is charged to protect and promote the public health of the citizens of Cabarrus County. Membership is as follows: Member or designee of the Board of County Commissioners; Member of the Cabarrus County Medical Society; Member of the Cabarrus Physicians Organization; Member or

designee of the CMC-NorthEast Medical Center Board of Trustees; and three members from the general public not affiliated with the above organizations, but recommended by the nominees of those organizations.

REGION F AGING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This committee advises the Centralina Council of Governments (COG) staff and COG Board on area plans for the aging within the nine-county region. County Commissioners appoint three members and one alternate to the 26-member regional committee. The appointments are for terms of two years except for the alternate appointment, which is a one-year term.

ROWAN-CABARRUS COMMUNITY COLLEGE (RCCC) BOARD OF TRUSTEES

This board governs the operation of the community college according to State law. The Cabarrus County Board of Commissioners makes two four-year appointments to the Board of Trustees.

SENIOR CENTERS ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Senior Centers Advisory Council aids in determining senior citizen activities to be provided by the County as well as activities and operations at the senior centers. The council is comprised of 11 members who work closely with the Active Living and Parks Department and Senior Center staff. Appointments are for three-year terms.

TOURISM AUTHORITY

This 9-member board is charged with the development of tourism, tourist-related events, facilities and other activities that serve to increase the amount of tourism in the County. The Board of Commissioners appoints membership as follows: Three members, including a County Commissioner and/or County Manager; three members from recommendations submitted by the Cabarrus County Tourism Authority; and three members from recommendations submitted by the Cabarrus Regional Chamber of Commerce. Appointments are for terms of three years.

TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD

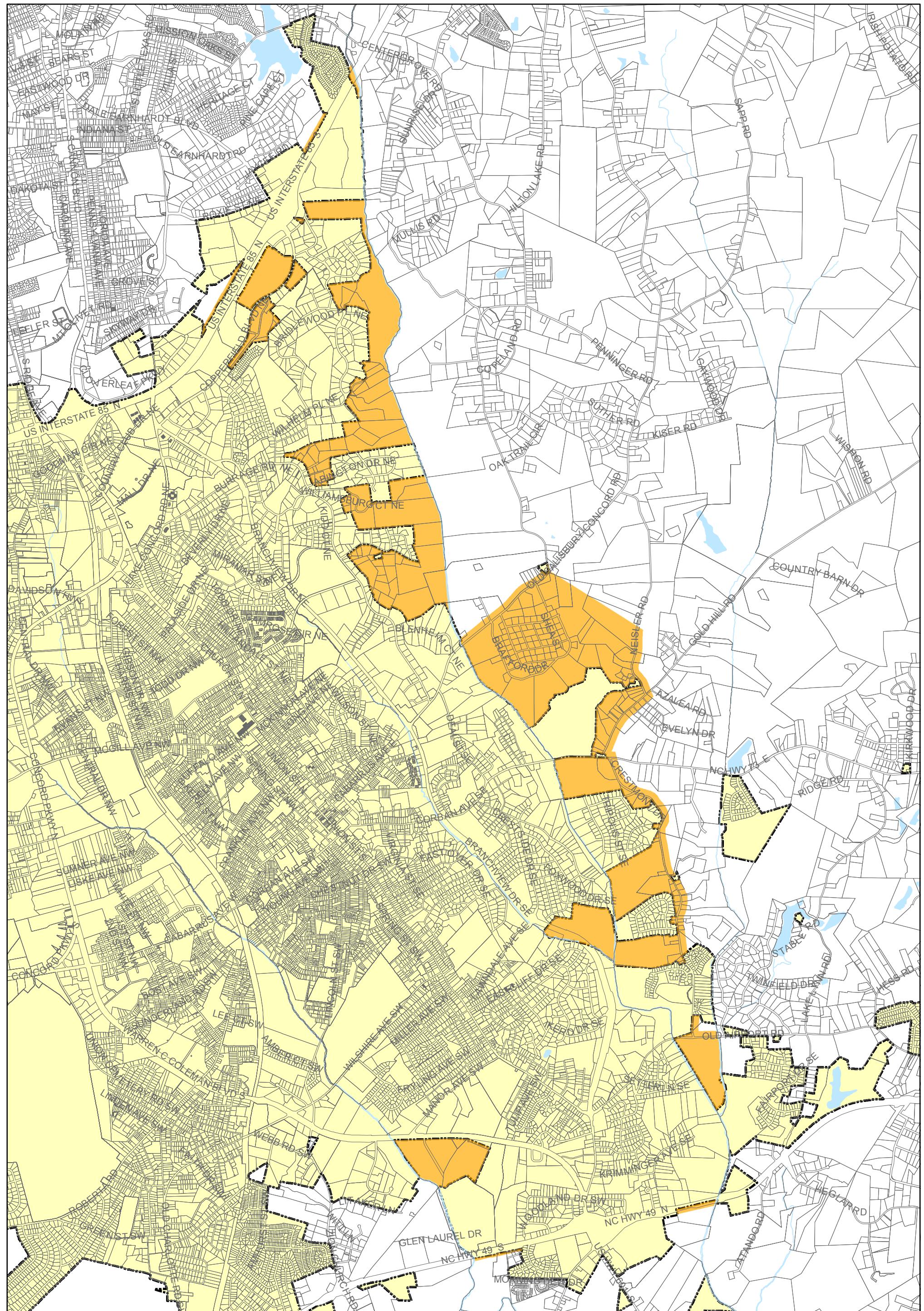
This board works to advance coordination between the County and human service agencies, to monitor transportation services and to advise the Board on issues related to human service transportation policy matters. Members include representatives from the Department of Social Services, Cabarrus Health Alliance, Department of Aging, Cabarrus EMS, L.I.F.E. Center, Cabarrus Workshop, Healthy Cabarrus, Head Start, Piedmont Behavioral Healthcare and a representative of the visually impaired in the county.

WATER & SEWER AUTHORITY OF CABARRUS COUNTY

The Water and Sewer Authority (WSACC) was established in 1992 by Cabarrus County and the four municipalities for the purpose of planning, constructing, owning, operating and maintaining water and sewer facilities in Cabarrus County. Membership of the board is as follows: two members appointed by Cabarrus County; two members appointed by the City of Concord; two members appointed by the City of Kannapolis; one member appointed by the Town of Harrisburg; one member appointed by the Town of Mt. Pleasant; and one at-large member appointed by Cabarrus County with the advice of the municipalities. Appointments are for terms of three years.

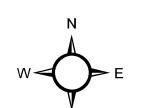
YOUTH COMMISSION

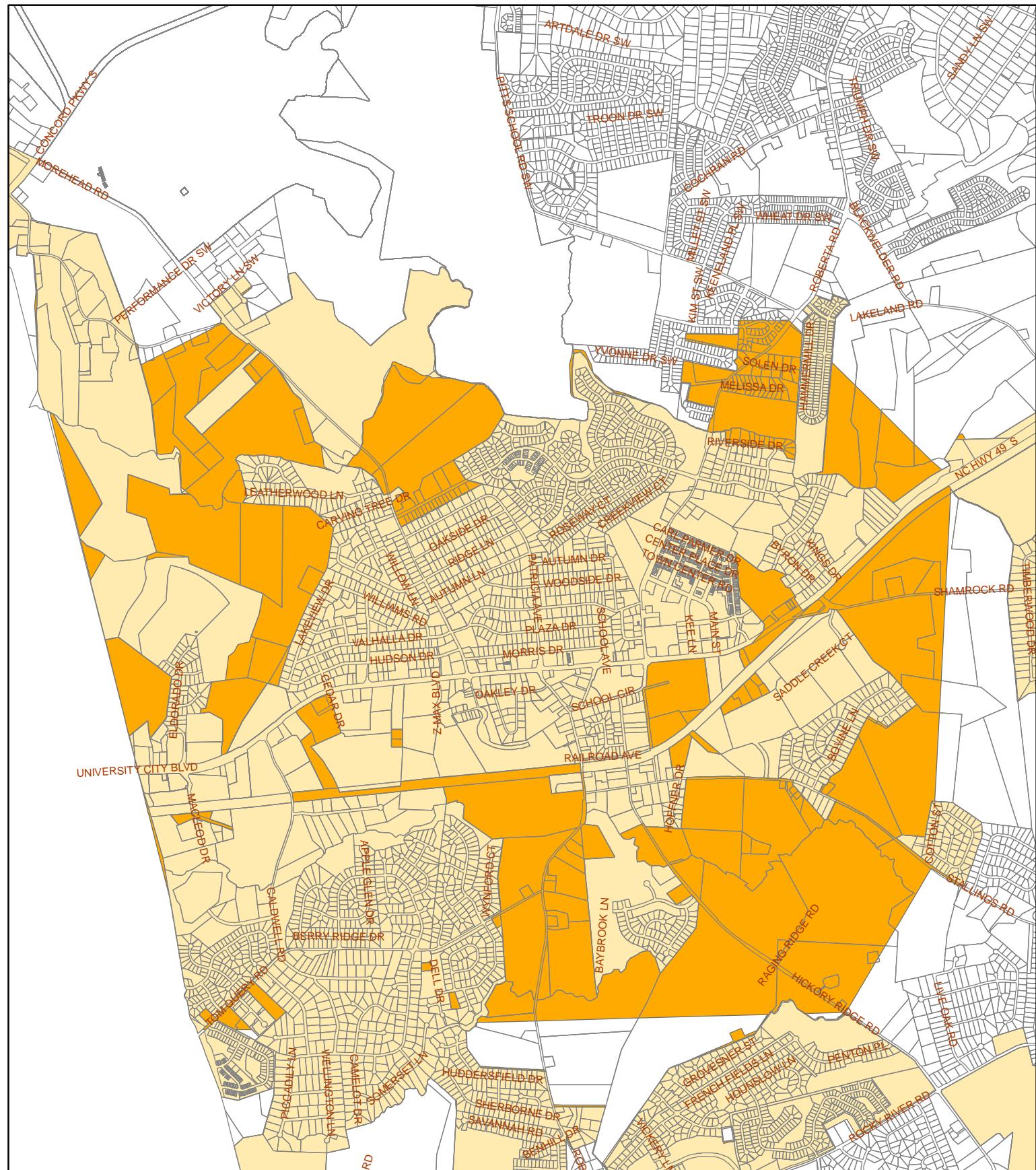


**City of Concord

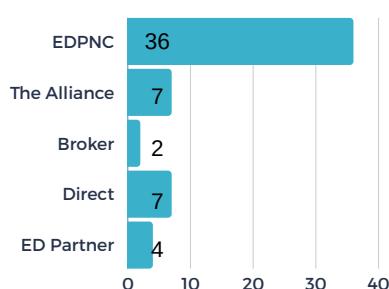

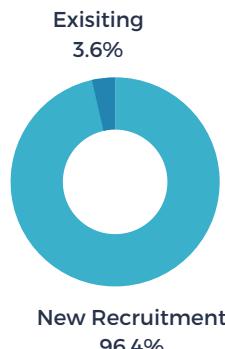

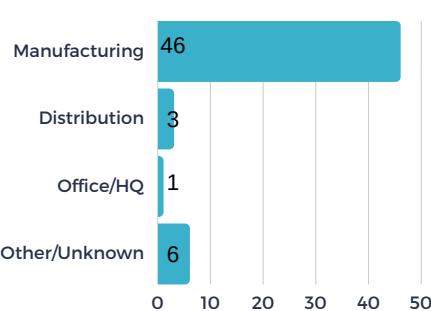
PROJECTS BY SOURCE



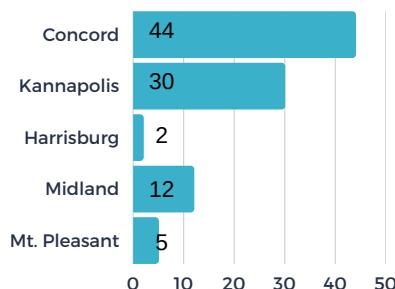
PROJECTS BY TYPE



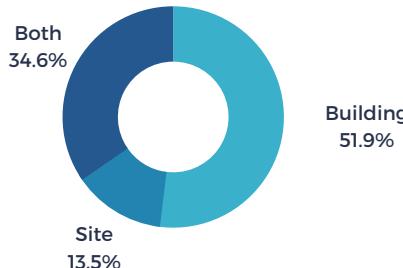
PROJECTS BY INDUSTRY
